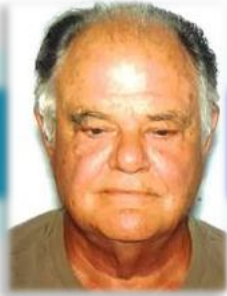

"Nobody Told Me..."

Shared with the Lenten Luncheon Crowd at Holy Family Parish in April 2025

Greetings! I'm Pastor Brenda Greenwald, and my **default mode** - the **fruit** of **MY** spirit, **has** been, and will **forever** be **JOY**. Yes...**JOY**. I'm sure it **doesn't** take too long to realize that my **smile** IS **sincere**, that my **laughter** IS **genuine**, that the **light** in my **eyes** is indeed a **glint** of **mischief**. And so, when I was told of the **Lenten Series** **here** at Holy Family, and ALL of the **options** were placed before me: **Finding Jesus** in Ordinary Places, in Community, in Serving Others, in Busy Family Life, well, the **OBVIOUS** choice for this girl of **JOY** was Finding Jesus in Times of..... **SORROW**.

Yes....**sorrow**. Because I **ALSO** come to you **today**, as the **totality** of all whom **God** crafted **me** to be: the **baby** born with only one eye, the **young adult** who found herself **alone** in the world, the **woman** unable to birth children of her own, AND the **funeral**-laden **Pastor** who stands before you now. It has taken me **YEARS** to **process** all the **STUFF** I just mentioned to you, **YEARS** to sort through my **emotions**, to find the **strength** to go on **YEARS** to balance the **weight** of it all. **TRULY**. I **had** my pick of topics...and I guess I just **wanted** to **share** with you that **Jesus** does **indeed** accompany us during times of **SORROW**.

Now, **before** you're officially **ordained** as a Pastor, they **throw** you into this really, **heavy** program called Clinical Pastoral Education, during one of your **summers**. That's a **fancy** title for **"You're Gonna Be Working at a Hospital. Good luck."** It's a **requirement** for **all** seminary students, and includes direct instruction, small-group time, conferencing, counseling, de-briefing, **AND**.....a **TON** of time with **REAL** patients in **REAL** situations on **REALLY** awful days in their lives. While I might have been **practicing** this new call of **Pastor**, the people I **met** that summer were **experiencing** their lives **changing**...in front of their eyes. It was **NOT** a practice or dress rehearsal for **them**, it was their **REAL** LIFE, and as a **Chaplain**, I had a front-row seat to **ALL** of the drama, the pain, SOME of the joy, and certainly, to all of the **emotion**.



*Now, among the **millions** of things I **learned** that summer, there are a few things that **nobody told me**:*

Nobody told me...what it would **feel** like when someone's actual **heart** stopped beating, or that I'd find myself assisting real EMTs at a **motorcycle** crash on a busy highway.

Nobody told me...what the faces of the **ER** staff would look like when they were unable to save a patient. or just how tiny a **miscarried** baby would be.

When those **hearts** stopped beating, and those **faces** crumbled, when those **babies** could no longer grow, when those **motorcyclists** lost hope... **JESUS was already there**.

Jesus was **on** the side of the **highway**, helping me recall what **VERY** little high school Spanish I could remember, and calmed me enough to make a bi-lingual **phone call** to the wife of the injured.

Jesus was absolutely in the **still** and small **quiet** of the **ER** as the **machines** were unplugged, and those **beeps** came to a merciful **stop**.

Jesus was RIGHT THERE, in the **pre-op room**, as I held hands in **prayer** with the parents to be...who no longer would.

We FIND Jesus in times of sorrow.



Nobody told me...that good **sleep** was such an ungraspable commodity, or how incredibly unhelpful all those fancy, EXPENSIVE, printed **books** and resources would be when it came time to **actually** offering **comfort**.

Nobody told me...that **burying** multiple **church** friends would only add to my heartache, or that when everyone else walks out of a room, a **Chaplain** walks in.

When I found myself without the **energy** to move, or at a total loss for **words**, when I watched **church lady** after church lady be lowered into the ground, or I entered yet another **room** of grief.... **JESUS** was **already there**.

Jesus was right there at 2a, hearing my pleas for **respite**, gifting me with **moments** (if not full nights) of **restful re-charge**.

Jesus didn't need no stinkin' fancy-pants books in the **ICU**: **Jesus** put the **words** on my **heart** and my **lips** when it came time to **speak**. (He also **ZIPPED** my lips when this talker was supposed to be quiet..!)

Jesus surrounded me with **women of faith** - those **alive** and those **gone ahead** - **ALL** summer-long, giving me **shoulders** to cry on, and **hugs** to be shared.

And there **wasn't** a room that I entered, a **threshold** that I didn't cross, where **Jesus** wasn't **already** with me: "Come, Holy Spirit."

We FIND Jesus in times of sorrow.

Nobody told me...what **courage** it would take to press **SEND** on the **phone** when calling a family member to **notify** them that their loved one had just **died**, or the stamina (and stomach) one **needs** when walking into the **ER** and greeting a **patient...and** their gruesome **injury**.



Nobody told me...just how cold and cramped a **morgue** really is, or how much **food** a family needs while waiting for their loved one to **die**.

When that person was **awakened** in the middle of the night by **my** call, or my stomach **turned** knowing that man would **lose** his hand; when I **shivered** inside that morgue or **replenished** the Comfort Cart of food for those families... **Jesus was already there**.

Jesus helped me **calmly** talk the shocked families through those calls, **staying** on the line with us until they **safely** arrived at the hospital.

Jesus was the one directing me to the person's **EYES**, not their injury, and helped words of **encouragement** come out of my mouth.

Jesus was with me as I **knelt** down in that cold morgue, having the **honor** of placing his **Rosary** beads inside that man's **lifeless** hands.

And we **KNOW** Jesus to be with us in the breaking of the **bread**, or, as it so often is in hospital **waiting** rooms, the breaking of the **chips**.

We FIND Jesus in times of sorrow.

Nobody told me...how my **heart** would literally skip a **beat** seeing a family member on the **ambulance stretcher** or what it would **feel** like to **hold** a **mother** as her child **died**.

Nobody told me...about the **wounding** and **breaking** of my **own** heart when the tiny, abandoned infant, whom we had cared for so deeply, would **DIE** in our arms at only 45 days old, or that, as **Chaplains**, we literally **deliver** the **remains** of the **miscarried** babies to the local **mortuary**, where they lay those sweet and deeply loved babies to **rest**.

When the **panic** set in, and the **wailing** ensued, when she took her last **breaths**, and the little **babes** took away **mine...** **Jesus was already there**.

Jesus gave me thoughtful **colleagues** to carry my **shifts**, when I had to change **hats** from Chaplain to **family**.



Jesus stood ready to welcome the dying **man** into **His** arms, as I **held** the sobbing mother in mine.

Jesus brought a **baby girl** into our **hearts**, to **love** and to **treasure**, even if her life here on earth was so **short**.

Jesus was with **ME**, helping **MY** heart understand, that **perhaps THIS** was how I was meant to **carry** children, at least in this **moment**, and in this **space**.

We FIND Jesus in times of sorrow.

Nobody told me...that I would literally live out the '**pray unceasingly**' part of Scripture...**EVERY MINUTE.** or that even **Atheists** want Chaplains to **stay** in their rooms and listen to their **story**.

Nobody told me...that the **sound** of a helicopter or an ambulance will forever make me **PAUSE** or that I'd be **coaching** people out of **completing** suicide. **Often.**

When it felt like the **prayers** would never end, or when the **LAST** thing someone **wanted** was prayer; when the **rotor blades** could be heard in the distance, or I had to quell the **panic** of not pushing someone past the **brink...** **Jesus was already there.**

Jesus was the one listening to EVERY. SINGLE. **PRAYER**, even if I didn't have the **energy** to say the words. **Jesus** constantly reminded there **isn't** a person alive whom **God** didn't love, **even** if the person said **they** didn't love God.

Jesus was the one guiding those **helicopter** pilots **safely** to the ground.

Jesus was the one **guiding** every hope-filled **word** that escaped my lips.



We FIND Jesus in times of sorrow.

Mind, you - that summer wasn't **ALL** sorrow. There **were** times that were equally **reverent** AND **RIDICULOUS**, and **Jesus** was in the middle of it all.

Like the fact that **Chaplains** often double as **bouncers** when it comes to unruly or unwanted **visitors** or family **members**: *Give me the strength, **Jesus**, not to DECK this guy!*

Like that one night when a **drunk** uncle pulled an **8-inch hunting knife** on me, demanding to be let into the hospital? HA! **Jesus** gave my brain the **wherewithal** to kick-in to FULL ON TEACHER MODE: "Uh-uh. You give me that knife. Right now. Let's go" Proud to say that the knife was immediately and safely **confiscated**, *(and I didn't even **FREAK OUT...**until I was in the elevator, much later!)*



Who knew that teaching **piano** lessons on weekends would be a welcome **escape**!?

Thank you, **Jesus**, for budding musicians!

Truly. **Jesus** was all over that summer. This was a **Trauma 1** hospital in Littleton, **Colorado**, so, those **Rocky Mountains**? Incredibly healing. Those **sunrises** and **sunsets**?

Balm for my soul.

My former **students** would come for lunch, my **friends** would bring their giggling **babies**, the **lobby** always had a **kid** on the loose.

The Face of Jesus SURROUNDED me that summer.

So, what nobody told me...was that even **someone** with **this** much energy **has** the **capacity** to quietly and compassionately **minister** to those in need.

Nobody told me...just how splashed with **grace** I would be by the patients who kindly received me - into their **rooms**, into their **lives**, into their **stories**.

Nobody told me...how the **Holy Spirit** would **dance** amongst **ALL** of the **workers** at a hospital, and what **holy** ground I'd be walking upon.

Nobody told me...that *that* was the **summer** I would **FIND Jesus in times of sorrow**. **AMEN.**
